

## Quilt Guild Bingo

You will need to bring your **fabric game card and buttons** for markers. Your completed bingo card will be a 25 patch — 5 rows of 5 squares each. As in traditional bingo the more cards you have in front of you, the more chances you have to win. Feel free to make as many cards as you like, following these directions.

Here's what you need to make your fabric game card: Cut 2½" squares:

- 5 assorted greens
- 5 assorted blue
- 4 assorted pink/purple
- 1 black
- 5 assorted red
- 5 assorted yellow/orange



Each color row needs to have one color but a variety of fabrics. Each fabric needs to fall into one of the following categories:

- Batik
- Floral
- Geometric
- Heart
- Leaf
- Dot
- Metallic
- Holiday
- Novelty
- Paisley
- Plaid
- Solid
- Star
- Stripe
- 1930's print.

When cutting out your squares, be sure to use fabrics from the categories listed above. You do not have to use all of the categories, but try to have an assortment. It is important to use 5 different categories in each color row. Sew squares into a 25 patch. As you are joining the squares, please use an accurate ¼" seam allowance.

Fabrics are arranged like this sample block.



You'll notice that

- The green column, top to bottom, has these categories: floral, metallic, leaf, novelty, holiday
- The blue column, batik, geometric, plaid, star, holiday, etc.

Once you go through your stash, you'll discover this is easier than you'd think!

To play, the bingo caller will randomly select a call card and read, for example, Yellow Batik, or Blue Star, or Red 1930's. (The black center square is a free space.) A player wins by being the first to cover one row of five squares in any direction, plus other fun games. There will be prizes for the first to yell, "Bingo!"
